














Now, the significance of stories is this. While many stories are often no more than entertainment, narratives are actually so foundational to how we think that they determine how we understand and live life itself. The term "worldview," from the German word Weltanschauung, means the comprehensive perspective from which we interpret all of reality. But a worldview is not merely a set of philosophical bullet points. It is essentially a master narrative, a fundamental story about (a) what human life in the world should be like, (b) what has knocked it off balance, and (c) what can be done to make it right. 149 No one can really function in the world without some working answers to those big questions, and so, to provide those answers, we adopt a worldstory, a narrative that explains things—a worldview.

Keller says that a Worldview is a <u>narrative</u> and this is more than just a list of philosophical bullet points.

Summit Ministries gives this chart, which just is a list of philosophical bullet points, to help students understand the "key players in the world of ideas."



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Who's right?



They're BOTH right!

Summit's chart isn't offering a definition of "worldview". Rather, it's a very helpful tool for identifying the key points of disagreement between prominent worldviews.



Keller is helpful here:

Worldviews are narratives!
And, seeing this is imperative for implementing effective worldview integration.





Worldview Integration?



The opposite of <u>integration</u> is <u>compartmentalization</u>.

One's worldview is compartmentalized when one has multiple inconsistent stories that one uses to understand the different parts of life.



Worldview Integration?



For example:

At church, love is the highest good.

At work, \$\$\$ is the highest good.

While watching UT play football, anything that helps us beat the hell outta OU is worth doing...





Worldview Integration?



Alternatively, one's worldview is <u>integrated</u> when one has one story that one uses to understand all the different parts of life.



Ethics?!

Could a Christian with a maximally integrated worldview intentionally deceive one of her opponents in a boardgame?

Put another way: how good would Jesus be at playing a Fascist in Secret Hitler?

Diagnosing the Problem



B.I.B.L.E. = <u>Basic Instructions Before</u> <u>Leaving Earth</u>

This song makes it seem like the Christian story is *just* a story about how to escape death.



Diagnosing the Problem



We can express this view using Keller's Worldview formula as follows:

What should life be like?

- What should life be like?
 - We should go to heaven when we die.

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 - Humans disobeyed God and now deserve to go to Hell when they die.
- What can be done to make this right?
 - Jesus Christ came to earth as a human and made a way for us to be saved through his death on the cross.

The Problem Diagnosed




The B.I.B.L.E. expression of the Christian Worldview is TOO NARROW!

It's near silent concerning the questions:


- Who am I?

The Lord's Prayer




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
This matters: narrow expressions of the Christian Worldview resist effective worldview integration.















The Way Forward



Finding success in worldview integration requires understanding how all encompassing the Christian Worldview actually is.

The Christian Worldview

- What should life be like?
 - The Kingdom of Earth should be unified with the Kingdom of Heaven, like it was at <u>creation</u>.
- What has knocked this off balance?
 - The <u>fall</u>, when humanity rebelled against God and broke the unity of Heaven and Earth.
- What can be done to make this right?
 - Jesus Christ, God incarnate, came to earth as a human and made the way for us to be <u>redeemed</u> through his death and resurrection. He continues to <u>restore</u> the unity between heaven and earth through his body, the church, until he returns again.

Classroom Exercise

We have the students find Christians to interview and they ask them two questions:

- 1) What's the mission of the Church?
- 2) How do you help accomplish that mission *directly* through your vocation?



Exercise Results

It's encouraging! Many adult Christians have beautiful and wise answers that help our students grow in their worldview integration.



Exercise Results

However, those interviewed who struggle to integrate their vocation into a Christian Worldview VIRTUALLY ALWAYS express the Christian Worldview too narrowly.

 BibleProject and Summit have excellent resources for seeing how all encompassing the Christian Worldview is.



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
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- Don't just get locked in on what your discipline can accomplish; remember to explore all the ways that studying your discipline can improve your students' character.
