#### **Transformative Discipleship Methods**

Jesus' 9 Discipleship Methods		
Teach biblical truth by proclaiming and making biblical truth come alive in a real, tangible, clear way	Expose students to competing truth claims and culture while showing its errors and incoherence with a biblical worldview	Connect the learning to something specific from the world that students are experiencing and living in
Invest in the student through role modeling or bringing in a professional or mentor	Incorporate/teach a habit of Jesus (Bible study, prayer, solitude, fasting, stewardship, etc.)	Create opportunities for students to engage with a like-minded community
Create a pathway to create disciples or pass on something they know to another person	Create opportunities for students to apply their biblical training, beliefs, and values to content and to the world around them	Differentiate the spiritual journey
